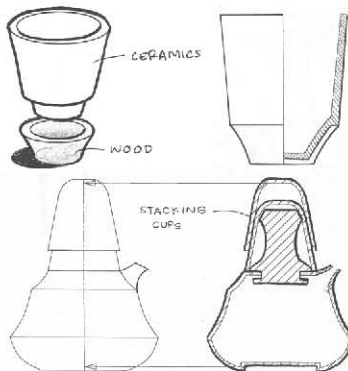


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For centuries, the kendi has played a very important role in the rituals and daily life in the Indonesian Archipelago. Originally used as a container for holy water during ceremonies, it later evolved into a practical appliance for carrying water from village to village. Today, it's versatility has transformed the vessel into an heirloom that is passed down through the generations.

Inspired by its cultural significance and elegant shape, Jenggala has modified the Kendi by adapting its silhouette as the inspiration for a teapot with a comfortable wooden handle. A matching cup accompanies this stylish yet wholesome design, although traditionally one would point the spout directly at the mouth and drink.

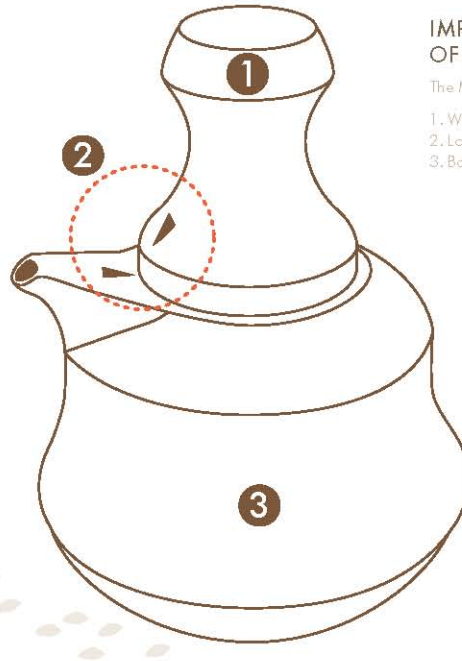

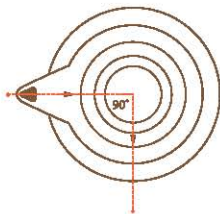
IMPORTANT PARTS OF THE KENDI

The Modern Kendi Consists of:

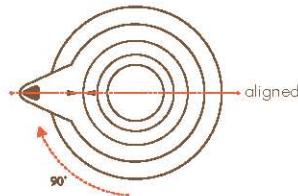
1. Wooden Handle for a firm grip
2. Lock Arrow, part of the locking system
3. Body to contain tea or coffee

MODERN KENDI'S LOCKING SYSTEM

1. Attach the handle to the body, by lining up the arrow on the body and the handle at a 90° to each other.



2. Turn the handle 90° clockwise to lock. Make sure both arrows are in line with each other.



PROPER HOLDING FOR THE KENDI

When carrying, we recommend holding the base to prevent from falling.
